Guarding the Good Deposit **Examples – Bad and Good** 2 Timothy 1:15-18

Question: What does it look like to Guard the Gospel?

I. Bad Examples – Desertions (vs.15)

II. Good Example – A Refreshing Servant (vs.16-18)

"Then the righteous will answer him, 'Lord when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you something to drink? When did we see you a stranger and invite you in, or needing clothes and clothe you? When did we see you sick or in prison and go to visit you?'

"The King will reply, 'Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these my brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me." (Matthew 25:37-40, NIV)

Points to Ponder: If Paul had chosen to use our life as an example for Timothy, on which side of the divide would he have placed us? Would our life be used as a bad or a good example (i.e. one to avoid or follow)?
